Tenants for TAMA

New tenants for the Turkeyfoot Area Medical Association's new building in Confluence is the Yough Valley Pharmacy. John Ristway and Jon Jacobs, pharmacists, are operating the store. Both have worked locally in area pharmacies previously. TAMA had purchased the building, used formerly as a bank, and renovated it, offering medical services of Dr. Van Antwerp,

on one side, and the pharmacy on the other. The pharmacy is open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Thursday and on Saturday, and from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Friday. The store, according to Jacobs, will restore professional pharmaceutical care to Confluence for the first time in about 50 years.
